These new members recognize that PACE serves both economic development and energy conservation goals by helping owners improve the energy performance and value of their buildings.

“Broome County sees Energize NY PACE as the best opportunity for encouraging investment by existing properties in renewable energy as well as energy efficiency,” said Jason Garnar, Broome County Executive. “We believe that offering PACE to our business and nonprofit communities will be a significant step towards preserving our natural environment, creating jobs in an expanding market, and making the building stock in Broome County more attractive and competitive.”

Sullivan County Executive Potosek echoed those sentiments. “Energize NY PACE is an important tool for the county and its business community as it provides access to affordable clean energy projects and represents a sound investment in building a sustainable future,” he said.

“Economic development is a top priority of the county legislature and this [PACE] initiative fits well with our agenda,” said Sullivan County Legislature Chair, Luis Alvarez. “Improving [Sullivan’s] building stock with clean and efficient energy systems is not only good for business, but also good for our environment.”

“All size businesses as well as nonprofits can benefit from modernizing their energy infrastructure, and Energize NY PACE provides long-term, low-cost capital should a business choose to take advantage of this opportunity,” said Albany County Executive Daniel P. McCoy.

Request for Qualifications (RFQ) Expanding the Market for PACE Finance in NY

Last week Energize NY issued an [RFQ](#) targeted to project developers and other businesses that have a clean energy product or service that could benefit from pairing with PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) financing in a systematic way to help expand their businesses.

In connection with the RFQ, NYSERDA issued for comment [new commercial PACE guidelines](#) that are intended to make it easier for clean energy projects to qualify for PACE financing in New York. These guidelines would allow for clean energy projects that do not otherwise qualify for a NYSERDA or utility program to be financed with PACE.

Together, the proposed commercial PACE Guidelines and RFQ are expected to make PACE financing available to a significantly broader range of clean energy projects and project developers. Read more in the [press release](#).
